



We all know how much different companies and countries copied off each other. With hardly any glass marked, your set could have been made almost anywhere. Could be that the glass was exported to another country that made the holder. With all the internet sales now, not to mention people traveling all over the world, we can't assume that because something was bought in one country that it was made there. Maybe your Amsterdam seller got it in England themselves and called it English. Who knows? We may never know where or when the majority of what we own was made. But it's fun to share them all with others, isn't it?

I hope everyone realizes that all the catalog pictures can be clicked on to view them larger. With operating systems changing all the time, I have noticed that when I click on a picture on the web now to enlarge it, it still resizes itself to fit on my monitor screen. But then the cursor is a little magnifying glass with a + sign in it. If you click on the picture, it will enlarge to the full size. Then the magnifying glass has a - in it instead. Click again and it goes back to fit onto the screen. I have Windows 7 and I'm not even sure if it's a Windows thing or an Internet Explorer thing. But if you have an older system and the pictures only fit onto your screen, then follow the instructions I have shown in the link at the top of the Catalogs page. Once you change that setting it should stay that way, and will not affect anything else.

I would guess that probably 99% do, or did. But I rather doubt that blue and white faded set I showed in M9 ever did. I know the picture is too small to see the detail. The top edge flares outward and from a distance, or that small picture, it looks like it should have a lid too. But the wavy design of the china has bumps and indents in the neck just below the very top edge on the inside. A top with a collar section that would have to set down into the mustard would either have to match that oddness perfectly, or be very small to fit inside all the bumps. Another point is that a notch for that larger sized matching spoon would have to be a very large notch. It's not a salt spoon because it's way too large for the salt. Whenever I see condiment sets with no lid now, I always look to see if it should, or could, have had a lid. So many of those German sets with the barrel shaped mustard may not have had lids. They were made as inexpensive souvenir pieces, so maybe they were sold without lids. But then every so often I see that shape with a lid - not necessarily the souvenir sets - just that same shape. I think I have a blue and white set (or five) in that general shape, not all with mustard lids!

Regarding rims. Scratches and picks could be from a speep so that's pet a sure sign of a lid, but wear all.

Regarding rims...Scratches and nicks could be from a spoon so that's not a sure sign of a lid, but wear all around the very top would be. Another way to tell if something may have had a lid at one time is that the rim edge might not be glazed. Glaze can chip more easily than unglazed hard ceramic. That's why you

may see a lot of French faience with missing glaze in spots, but the form itself is undamaged. This is not generally seen in condiment sets where the entire piece, inside and out, is glazed. But I have seen some small trinket box bottoms that could easily pass as open salts should have had lids because they have an unglazed top edge.

We will never know all there is to know. We should just know what to look for in making good decisions when we buy. The pink set with the lady is pretty enough, and scarce enough I would say, to buy with or without a lid. I know I've never seen another like it.
