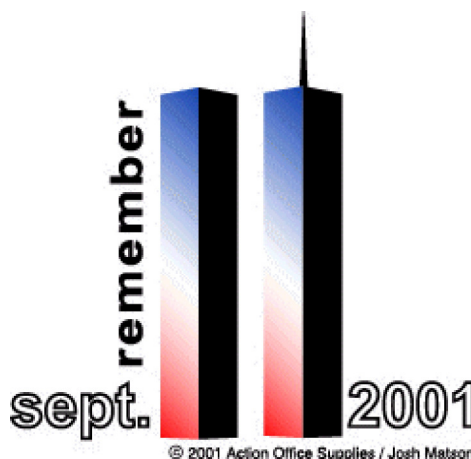

A similar set was made by COOPERATIVE FLINT and those shakers have a diamond pattern that has a line at the top and the diamonds do not go into the domed part. A SMALLER BASKET DOUBLE WAS MADE BY MCKEE AROUND THE TURN OF THE CENTURY. Strangely I got it correct with the photos. THANKS!!!</p>

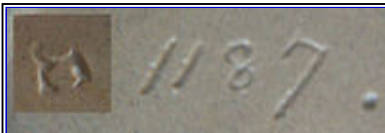
