Also see Vallerysthal 1894, 1st row on the right. Your #10 looks like Radeburg (Germany) 1890. Top of handle isn't flat though. Also see Villeroy & Boch (Germany) 1874 and 1908. Janelle: I think I have a double like yours in clear glass. Yours looks blue but maybe it is clear too. I'll have to venture into the cold room to look at my doubles. I thought I saw it pictured somewhere but no luck so far. Brrr! Really cold here now! I knew the snow would be back. Edit update: Just found Janelle's #16 in the German Brockwitz catalog for 1915 (3rd row down, picture on the left) and 1936. Also Fenner 1909 and 1935 and VMG Walther 1931. Don't forget to click on them to enlarge the pictures. And after you click, if you get a little magnifying glass picture when you put your mouse over it, click again and it will get even larger. We know that Fenner actually made glass. However, this design appears to have been used by Rindskopf in their 1920 catalog, in Brockwitz's 1928 and 1931 catalog as a 8383 and Walther's 1930 catalog as Berlin. I do not see a difference between them, but none of the catalog pages show the bottom of the bowl. It is possible these were made by a third party (and as I said it was most likely Fenner) and marketed by these other companies. Brockwitz, Rindskopf and Walther did market other manufacturers glass.
