

After a tooth broke off completely I was faced with the decision of an upper denture or an implant. Because my teeth have always been weak I knew it would come to a denture decision at some point so I decided to do it now rather than paying for one tooth at a time now and eventually just losing all of that anyway. But I have, should say I had, a tori palate which is a bone growth on the roof of the mouth. I never knew it wasn't normal but it had to be ground down in order to fit an upper plate. That's where all the problem has been. The stitches came out the first time after just a couple days. When I went back the

	<p>following week, he ground down more of the bone and did the stitches again but they came out again after a few days and it was infected. The added antibiotics made me really sick and I couldn't eat or drink anything for about three days. Last week I was sent to an oral surgeon and given some heavy duty antibiotics in a mouthwash so I wouldn't have to ingest it. Had another appointment yesterday and that did the trick and the roof of the mouth is on the mend. But there was a sharp area where the upper gum was healing and it had to be removed yesterday so more stitches. I was supposed to call my regular dentist and go back to him next week. Just called a little while ago to make an appointment and he's out all next week so I can't see him until September 9. Just my luck. Another 10 days of Lipton Chicken Noodle soup, Carnation Instant Breakfast drink, applesauce and blueberry yogurt (no flavors with small seeds like strawberry or raspberry). At least I can handle more than room temperature foods now. Hopefully on Sept. 9 the temporary can be refitted and I'll be able to chew something.</p> <p>I always knew I had a gag reflex but that was never brought up to help me make my decision. I didn't know that would make a difference. I am going to have to try a 3/4 palate and if that doesn't work I'll have to get a palateless denture and that involves implants to hold it in place. Not to mention it costs a small fortune. What a freakin' mess. And no, no straws allowed.</p> <p>We'll stick with the "Harvest" topic for next month.
