

IP: 124.168.173.218	Harry Atkins of Atkins Bros, a famous firm of British Silversmiths designed these salt pourers. The design 555684 was registered in 1910-11. He also designed a similar set that was plainer and rounder. The salt was tipped up and came out the spout, doing away with a salt spoon . They are Sheffield Silver with a makers mark and date of 1912. I have never seen anything other than the rounder set, that resembled these salts. They were sold by J.W Benson Ltd, a jeweller famous in his own right for the pocket watches he designed and made. And they are engraved with "J", how could they not have been mine.
