The cats and dogs are often found on eBay and are quite pricey...here are a couple examples presently on eBay...Item #201419166518 & #400987864961. It is much harder to find them attached to an intaglio with a "shelf" for them to sit or in your case a salt that would accommodate the little cat or dog...nice find!!
