Transferware


Transferware is putting a tissue thin "decal" on the piece which is covered with glaze then fired. Flow blue transferware was originally a mistake where the piece was fired too long or with too much heat where the blue color bled. It became popular. There are not very many flow blue salts. All flow blue is transferware, but not all transferware is flow blue. Besides other solid colors (brown, red, green, black, purple and yellow) of transferware, there is also multicolored and chintz transferware. Look for a line that does not match up in the pattern.

That salt is also a good example of how a line might not always be found. Sometimes the decals were cut apart and portions applied so there would not be any lines. The ones with solid patterns like chintz will almost always have a definite line. And many borders will not always match perfectly either.

If given the choice between a cobalt salt and the same one in another color, I'd probably pick the cobalt unless it was something stunning like a rich ruby or emerald green. At this point in my collecting, something of another color is welcome but it has to be something special.
