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



Jet is a type of lignite, a precursor to coal, and is considered to be a minor gemstone. Jet is not considered a true mineral, but rather a mineraloid as it has an organic origin, being derived from decaying wood under extreme pressure.  When "jet black" is used as a color name, it doesn't mean it's actually "jet" as described above. Black intaglios are black glass like Jane said, not made of the "mineraloid". I also saw another description that said if you hold jet to light it may have a red tinge around the edges. Not to be confused with black amethyst which is also just a type of black glass. I think it's mostly used in mourning jewelry and French jet is most desirable. Probably where the spelling "jette" comes from.

It's shown in clear glass, ivy pattern, in Metz Early American Pattern Glass and called Sandwich Ivy. In the 2000 Ed, Metz corrected her ID to Eureopean rather than American glass, noted the dark version, which she called dark amethyst. Hold yours to a bright light and see if it doesn't show amethyst rather than true black. Metz guessed that the pedestal dish was for loaf sugar. I'll post a photo if I can get one.
