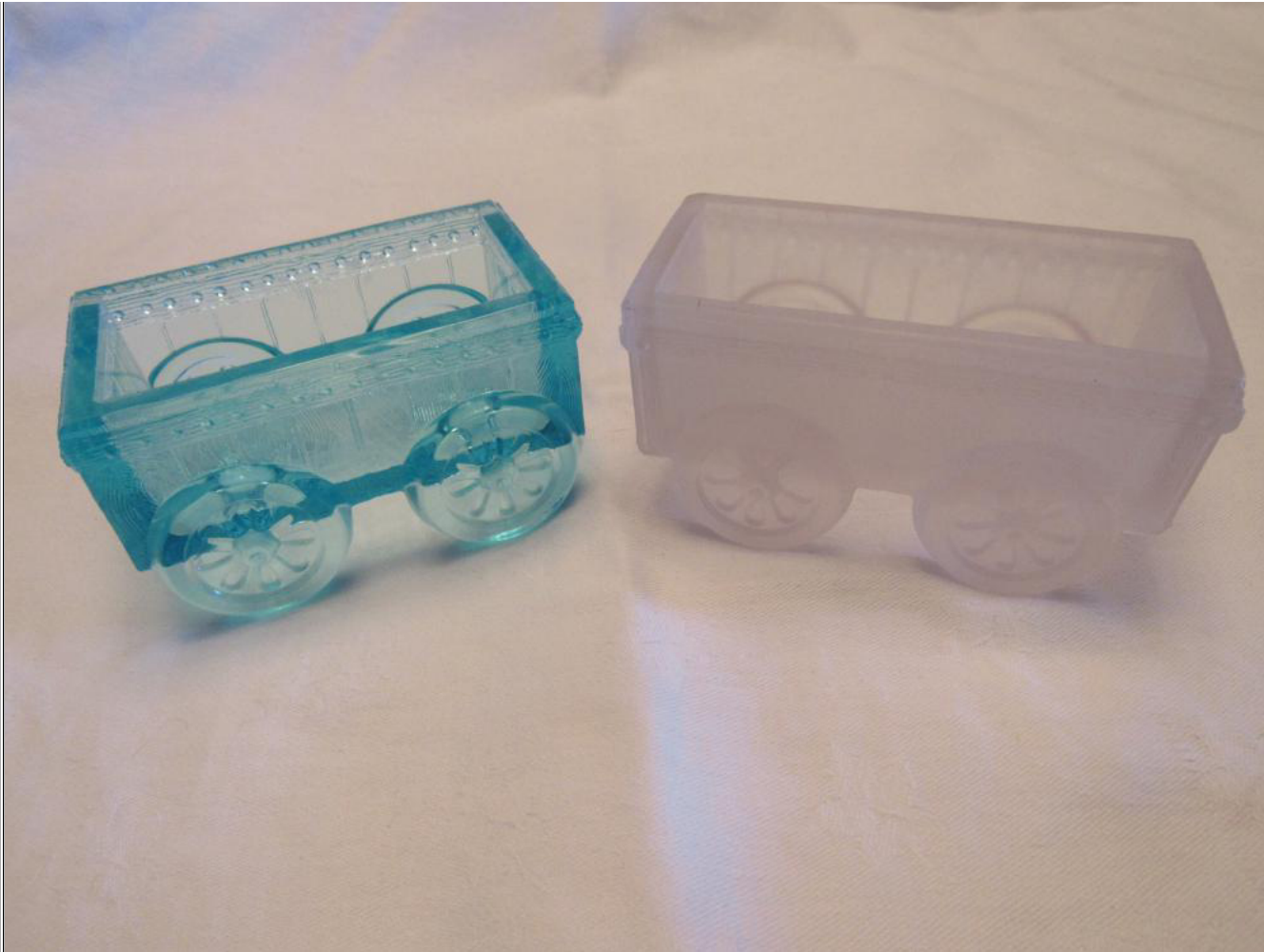

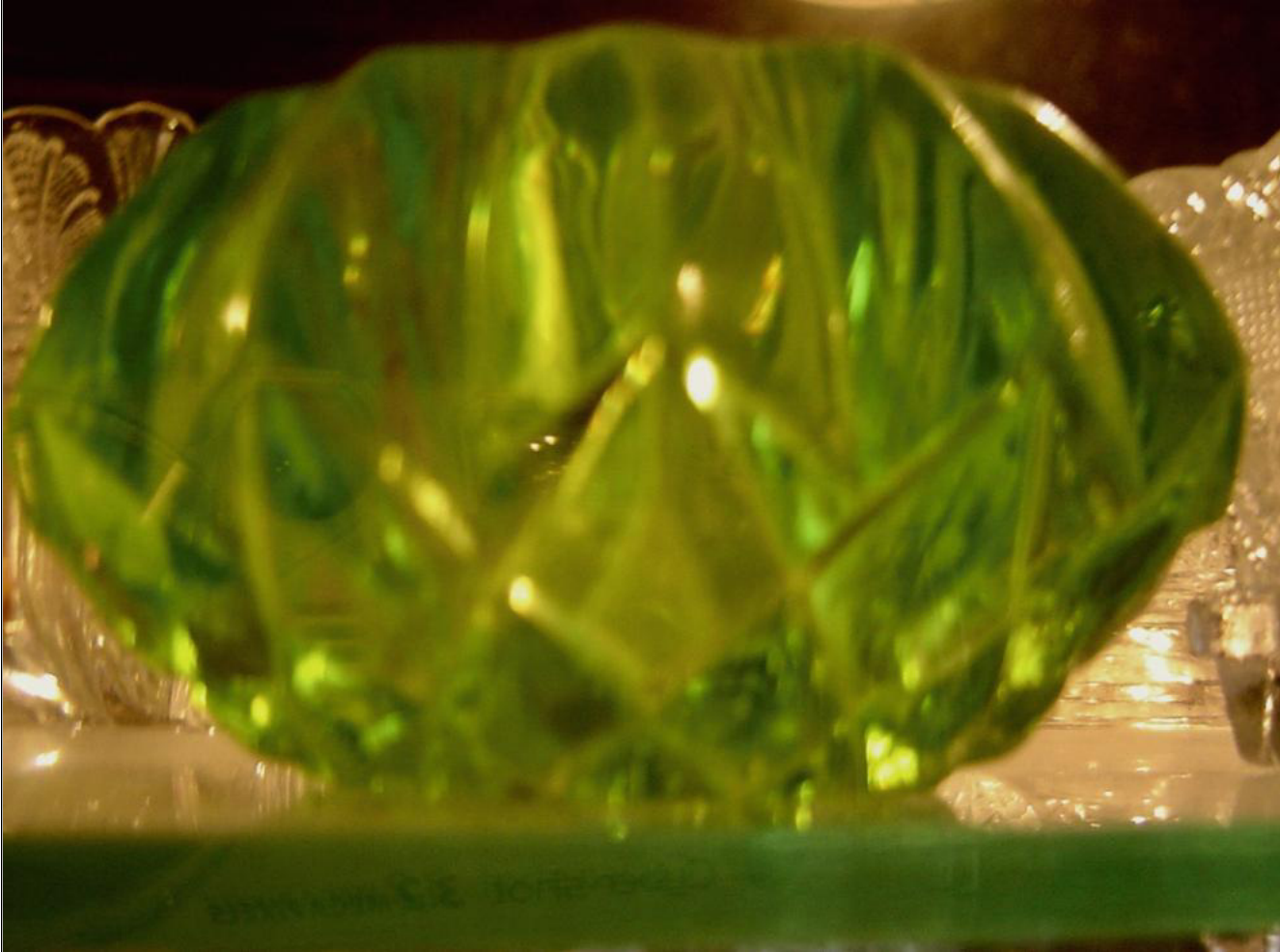


This one is from the Berg collection. It is amazingly pristine. Coddington's plate 41-4-4. Also in Smith's page 479-2-3. Beautiful Master.

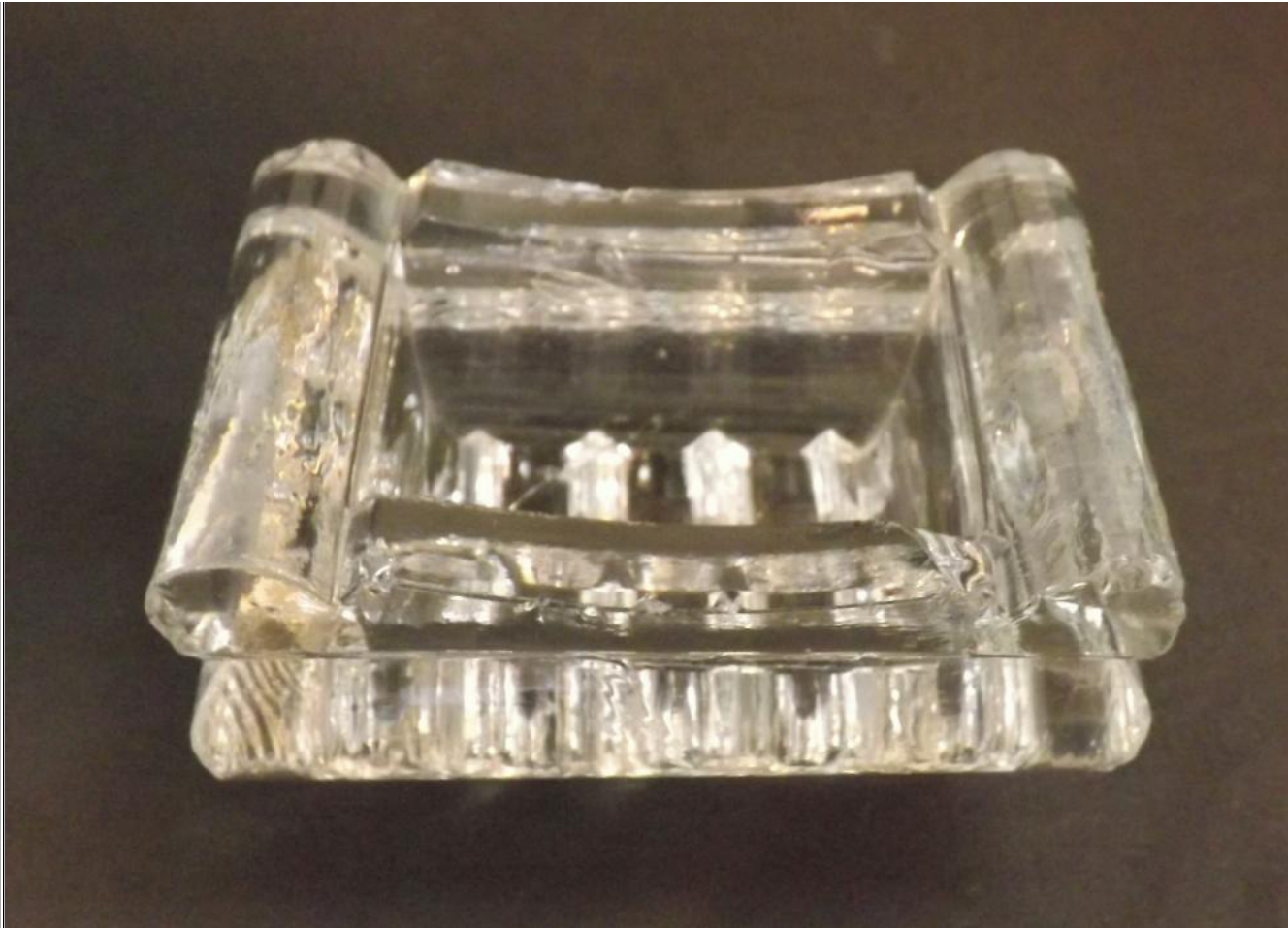

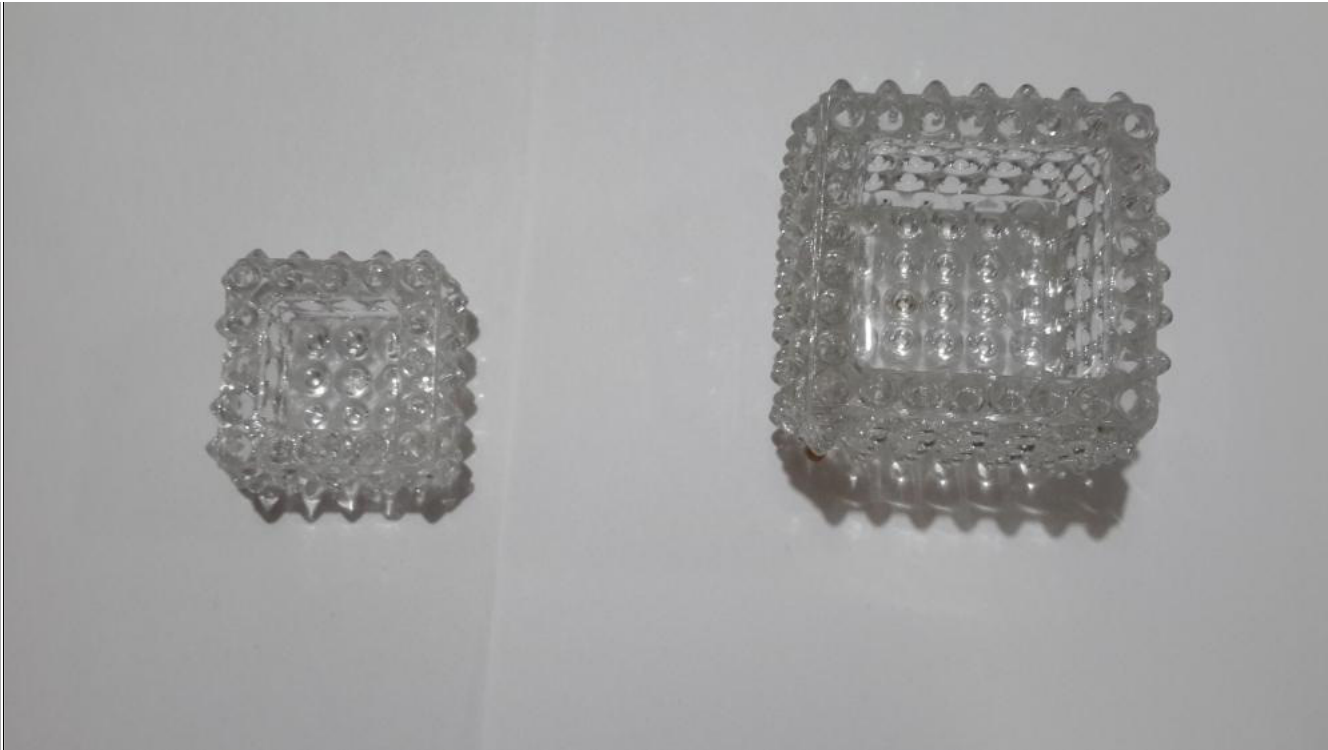
