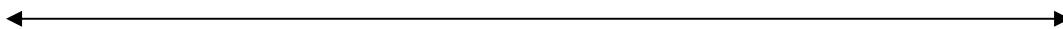

Description: LION - FROSTED OVAL MASTER SALT colorless and frosted. Gillinder & Sons. Fourth quarter 19th century. 2 3/8" H, 2 5/8" x 3 3/4". Undamaged.

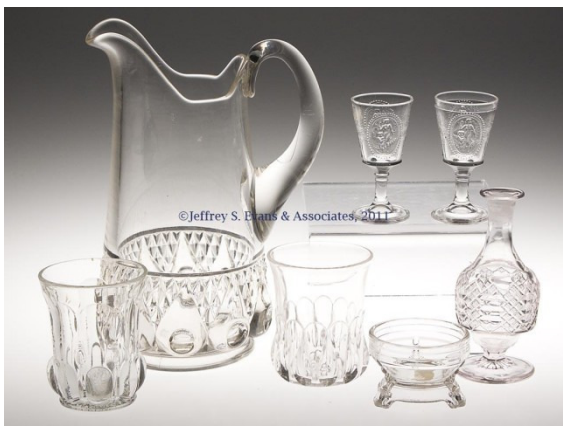


## Lot 144

Description: PALMETTE TABLE ARTICLES, LOT OF EIGHT, colorless, comprising a butter dish, open salt and eight sugar bowls. Fourth quarter 19th century. 2 1/2" to 4 7/8" H. Sugars and salt undamaged, one sugar with an annealing line to edge of foot, as made, butter with less than normal flakes/roughness to rims.

Description: VARIOUS EAPG ARTICLES, LOT OF SEVEN, colorless, comprising a Reverse Torpedo water pitcher, Jacob's Ladder cruet lacking stopper, two Cupid and Venus wine glasses, a Viking master salt, and Crystal Wedding and Michigan tumblers. Fourth quarter 19th century. 2" to 10 1/8" HOA. Boston & Sandwich Glass Co. and others. Third quarter 19th century. 4 7/8" and 3 1/4" HOA. White example with only a few minor rim flakes, clambroth example undamaged but with a potstone exhibiting a short refraction, as made.

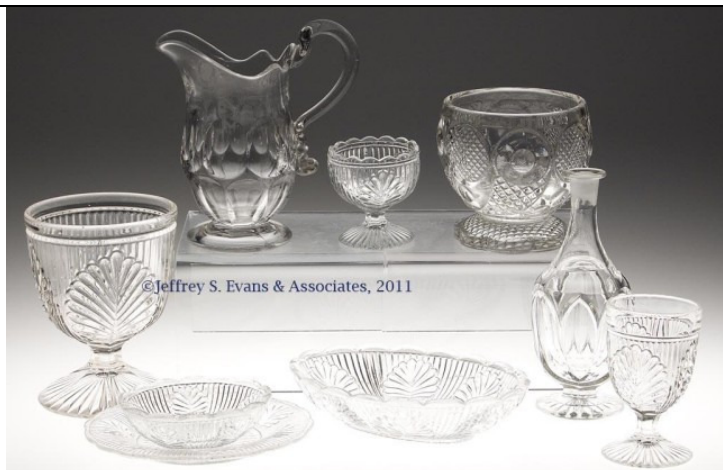
